CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO TOURISM SIGNS ON PROVINCIAL ROADS

- 1. Applicants for tourism signs shall undertake to accept in writing all conditions for the display of such signs before they are erected.
- 2. No tourism signs shall be erected before acceptable arrangements have been made for the display of follow-up signs to the specific facility.
- 3. All signs erected within the road reserve become the property of the road authority.
- 4. Any approval of an application for a road sign lapses after one year from the date of the approval. If the right to erect a road sign is not exercised within that period, a new application will have to be submitted.
- 5. Applicants shall be responsible for the cost of manufacturing the approved signs.
- 6. The applicant is obliged to adhere to the conditions listed below:
 - 6.1 The applicant shall have the approved sign(s) made to the specifications and instructions of the road authority at the applicant's expense. The quality of the material and the craftsmanship shall meet the prescribed requirements and shall be subject to testing by the road authority. Manufacturers who are approved by the road authority shall manufacture the signs.
 - 6.2 The applicant shall provide, at own expense, the road authority with the approved road signs to be erected.
 - 6.3 The applicant shall not hold the road authority liable for any loss or expense resulting from the relocation of, or amendment to, signs within the road reserve, irrespective of the reason for such change.
 - 6.4 The applicant shall not hold the road authority responsible for any damage to signs within the road reserve. This includes any damage caused by the road authority during construction, reconstruction or maintenance of roads, unless negligence by the road authority is proved.
 - 6.5 The continued display of any tourism sign may be reviewed at any time. If local tourism bureau and road authority decide that a particular tourism sign is no longer justified for a certain facility, the tourism authority may request the road authority to remove the sign.
 - 6.6 If the standards for signs change to such an extent that existing signs no longer comply with specifications, the road authority reserves the right to alter the signs to comply with set standards at the expense or the applicant.
- 7. Only the relevant road authority may erect a tourism sign. The facility owner shall be responsible for informing the road authority when the approved tourism sign has been made. Only approved sign designs will be erected.

8. The relevant road authority may impose any further conditions it deems necessary.
